- B. Justification grace- I am in Christ [1-4]
-Romans 3:23-24

1. Am I sinful? Jesus died as me- I am as sinless as Jesus
2. Am I righteous? Jesus lived as me- I am as righteous as Jesus
3. Am I loved by God? Jesus is loved as me- I am as loved as Jesus

- C. Glorification grace- Christ in me [5-8]
-Romans 5:1-2

- Phase 1: Born without glory [Romans 3:23]
Phase 2: The birth of glory in us [Romans 5:2]
Phase 3: The growth of glory in us [Romans 5:3-5]
Phase 4: The climax of glory in us [Romans 5:2; 1 John 3:2]
Phase 5: The endless growth of glory in us [Romans 5:2]

III. How do I receive grace?

- A. Repentance- foundation, confession, repetition, progression, [again and again]
-1 John 1:9
 1. Justification repentance- for salvation that leads to the change of identity
 2. Glorification repentance- for growth that leads to the change of character
